

Parent Governor Update



Children In Need



The wonderful life of Walter Tull

Walter Tull, who was born in 1888, was mixed heritage with his father from Barbados and his mother from Hougham, Folkestone. He had three sisters and siblings.

At the age of seven, dismally his mother died at the age of 42 in 1895. Tragically his father died two years after his mother. Although, he and his brother was sent to a children's home. Walter and Edward were the only two black children in the orphanage. They both got bullied ^{regularly} ~~regularly~~ by an older kid called Harry. One afternoon, Walter had an apple and there was a rule if you dropped it was not yours ^{called windsill} so Harry (the bully) pushed Walter but with his amazing football skills he saved the apple.

After a while, Walter is chosen for the children's home football team. He played in Bonner's team for a while and progressed into the local team (Clapton)



or then finally got scouted to a professional football team called Tottenham FC. The supporters had normally argued with Walter because of his skin colour. Eventually, he leaves Tottenham. After this, he wants to join Glasgow as his brother (Edward) had lived but World War I began.

Walter joins the War but sadly dies as he entered the land of No Man's Land, which nobody has ever returned from. Even though he was very brave, he never received a Military Cross. He had lead 26 men to safety in Italy. His body was not found even till today.




The life of Walter Tull.

Walter Tull was born in 1888 to a family of mixed heritage. His grandparents were slaves however his dad was the first free man in his family. His father who was born in Barbados learnt hard to be a carpenter.

By the time Walter was only nine-years-old, both of his parents had past away. His mother died two-weeks before his seventh birthday and his ^{dad} died when he was nine. Before his dad had died, he got married to Clara A.S. Tull. She sadly had to send Walter and Edward (his brother) as she couldn't take care of six children because she was very young.

Walter hated every about the orphanage. There was lots of white bullis that bullied Walter but the main bully was Harry. Walter was casually



eating an apple and if you drop your apple it is then classed as someone else (windyball.) Harry, attempted to trip Walter up to get his apple but Walter kicked the apple up to his knees to his back. After this day, all the white people started to include him in football. E.C.T. A few weeks later, Walter was the team captain for Bonner Road Childrens Home then got noticed by Clapton. Soon after, the First Division (Premier League) side Tottenham Hotspurs.

Walter's life changed dramatically when WWI broke out he joined the 17th Middlesex Regiment - the football Battalion. The war was finally about to end, but Walter got volunteered to go over NO Mans Land and then tragically got killed and no one how many times they tried his body was no one was to find his body. To being in an orphanage he will always be known as the first black-british officer.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

It's that time of year again where communities will soon be enjoying celebrations including Halloween, Diwali and Bonfire night.

Children and young people will break up from school this week and whilst this provides an opportunity for families and friends to spend some enjoyable time together, I want to remind you all of the dangers that this busy holiday period poses. The darker nights will soon be upon us, so ask yourself if you know where your child is going, who they are with and what they are doing.

Fireworks provide wonderful entertainment as part of an organised display. They can, however, be very dangerous when used inappropriately. Remember that in order to buy fireworks you must be over the age of 18 and they can only be purchased from registered sellers. Please remind your child of this: any child or young person found in possession of, or letting off fireworks in public commits an offence. More importantly, they also place themselves and members of the public in unnecessary danger.

Also, please be mindful of those vulnerable members of society who may be fearful at this time of year. I would ask you to ensure that your child does not cause unnecessary distress through their actions, whether by involving themselves in anti-social behaviour or associating with those engaging in such behaviour.

Sandwell Police are very proud of our relationship with the young people of Sandwell and our wider communities. We encourage families to spend time with each other and enjoy this season of the year.

At the same time I would ask you, as parents/guardians, to ensure that the whole of Sandwell can enjoy this time together, and that the actions of a few do not spoil the enjoyment of many. If we all ensure our own child is safe then we can be sure others are safe too.






