**Ukraine** - I did send a letter yesterday about our approach to the unfolding crisis in Ukraine. Our approach is to sensitively support pupil curiosity whilst at the same time ensuring that we don't unnecessarily alarm or worry children. **Staff support for Ukraine appeal** - As a staff group we are making a collection to send to the 'Ukrainian Humanitarian Appeal', which is linked to the UK government response, underpinned by a wide range of charities with proven track records of getting aid and support where it is needed.

The Government is match funding this so what ever we raise will be doubled.

**For our pupil, parent and staff community** we would like to support the initiative being co -ordinated by 'Dudley Community Polish Church' this has been suggested by Cath Beard (one of our parents and by Mrs Francis one of our Learning Support Staff. We aim to involve our Head Boys and Head Girls in this along with Y6 and Y5 who are having some learning sessions linked to this crisis.

#### Brook: Support Parents and Carers around Relationship and Sex Education

Brook has been commissioned to work for the next two years in Sandwell supporting parents and carers around Relationship and Sex Education (RSE). This is to provide parents and carers with the confidence and skills to discuss relationships and sex with their young people and support the mandatory RSE that the young people will be learning in school. In addition some sessions will be focussing on supporting young people with emotional wellbeing. **Brook will be running a series of Facebook Live sessions that parents and carers are invited to join.** The sessions will

be informal, and Brook will answer frequently asked questions, provide tips on how to discuss certain topics at home as well as provide the opportunity for live questions.

The sessions will run 6.30pm-7.30pm on the following dates:

**8 March 2022 - Mandatory RSE:** To give parents and carers an understanding of what RSE lessons at school will be covering, as well as equipping you with practical tools and knowledge to broach these subjects at home.

**16 March 2022 - Consent:** How do I explain what consent is to my child? This is a question that lots of parents and carers want to know about in order to support their child understand the true meaning of consent.

**24 March 2022 - Body Image:** What is body image and the importance of feeling positively about our bodies? How to support young people to understand that a positive body image is associated with better self-esteem, self-acceptance and healthy lifestyle behaviours, including a balanced approach to food and physical activity.

**28 March 2022 - Mental health:** What is mental health and wellbeing? And how can Parents and Carers support young people to have open discussions regarding mental health.

Brook will initially trial the above sessions and respond to any feedback before further sessions are booked in later in the year.


#### Red Nose Day

Children will also be taking part in a superhero mile challenge on our school track and will be setting themselves a goal to achieve and complete. The payment item will be set up on Parent Pay week commencing Monday 14th March.

#### **COVID** isolation guidance for pupils

If you are COVID positive you should still isolate for 5 full days if the LFT is negative on days 5 and 6. Or continue to isolate until day 10.

Although there is no longer a COVID-19 test and trace service – the expectation is that people do not go to school or mix when **they** are COVID positive.

#### Our Mile Challenge Results!

The Mile challenge helps to improve our physical, social and emotional wellbeing. Pupils in each class take ownership of the number of laps they complete each time and their class sports ambassador has the responsibility of recording the number of tracks completed. Pupils then challenge themselves to beat their own score each week by walking, jogging or running. At the end of each half term the number of tracks completed are added together to see which class has completed the most miles. The winning class is awarded with a trophy.

How does the Mile Challenge benefit our bodies?

- It helps us to improve our fitness levels
- It encourages us to be aware of our own health
- It gets us out into the fresh air, whatever the weather! We are lucky to have an allweather track
- It gives us a brain break so we feel ready to learn when we return to class.

#### Easter Bonnet Parade- Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> April

Also, as we are a Green Flag Eco School we are encouraging everybody to 'recycle' and 're-purpose' things we already have, so try to avoid purchasing new items.
