COVID Risk Assessment - As you are all aware we circulated a separate letter this week that explains our current COVID Risk Assessment and how we plan to return to even more 'normality' following the Easter break.

After school clubs - You will have seen in my letter, we aim to roll out a wider range of clubs after Easter. The three clubs we run currently (Eco, Yr 1 Phonics and Yr 6 SATs booster) are all really well attended, thank you for your support with these.


Ukraine Support - Thank you to the parents and carers who supported our appeal to donate items. These small things we do locally do make a big difference nationally and internationally. These funds are needed to support the 2.6 million refugees and rising. Less than a month ago their lives were so similar to ours – devastating. Our Year 6 pupils expressed their thoughts - *"We are overwhelmed with the amount of generous donations that have been brought in. These include: shampoo, torches, wipes, sleeping bags, nappies and more. All of the donations have been delivered to Dudley Community Church, which will then be taken to locations in Poland. Once again, we are very grateful for everything we have been sent and are thanking you as your kindness really makes a difference to the world."*

Our staff team raised £230, which has now been sent on to the [Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal | Disasters Emergency Committee \(dec.org.uk\)](https://www.dec.org.uk). This Humanitarian Appeal brings together 13 leading UK aid charities, including Red Cross and Save the Children. We will plan further fundraising events but we are mindful of financial pressures within households currently and other fundraising days we have planned. i.e. Red Nose Day today.

We did receive a lovely comment from a member of our school community: *"I wanted to say I think you're approaching this brilliantly. It's a worrying time for all of us. Let's face it, none of us know what's going to happen and each day I'm personally glued to news channels for updates. Which is why I wanted to thank teachers for being truthful with our children. Supporting them and allowing them a voice. I want my child to have the power of knowledge through learning. It is our beliefs that the more understanding they have of the world both positive and negative, can only help them develop and be equipped with common sense, understanding, compassion and democracy. This generation are the ones who can only benefit from that. All this makes me thankful for my family, my home, schools, food etc. All the things that are taken for granted. Again teaching appreciation to our children."*

Celebrating pupil work - It was lovely to receive the message below showcasing lovely Writing and it is a huge achievement by Amie in Year One - *"I wanted to share some positive news with you all and hope it brings a smile for you as it has done for me. Amie entered into a young writers competition during the Christmas Holidays. This is her own imagination story. This week we have learnt that Amie has been selected for publication, which will be 22nd April 2022. As you can imagine, I am incredibly proud of her."*

Other News

Medical Students

During the week commencing **Monday 25th April 2022**, we will be hosting two third year medical students from the University of Birmingham. The purpose of this week is to enable them to develop their knowledge and understanding of child development and interactions, as well as gaining experience and developing skills to help them relate to young children; all of which will be very important when they complete their Paediatrics rotation.

During their time at Temple Meadow, the students have a set list of tasks to complete. These not only benefit the students, but also school, as many of these link with the health aspect of the RSHE curriculum.

Such activities include:

- hearing children read and reading to children
- eating lunch with children and playing games with them
- teaching some year groups basic first aid skills
- giving a careers talk linked to the NHS
- delivering sessions to some year groups around healthy living, self-care and hygiene
- be available to parents before and after school, in the playground, to enable the families to understand working in the NHS, healthy eating and exercise.

This is where you come in. We would really appreciate your engagement with the medical students during this week, answering any of their questions or seeking their impartial advice or support.
