


Universal Free School Meals

Last week was the final week of the 'Sow and Grow' course for Year 3 parents and their children. Each week, parents and children have been busy learning about growing vegetables and herbs. They were able to plant in school and take plants home to nurture. Parents and children enjoyed the course and wished it could have been longer!



Year 4 Re-love event

Year 4 has been busy this term designing, setting up, advertising and running a pop-up clothing swap shop. On Monday 18th July 2022, they held their re-love event, where clean, quality donations of clothing were swapped in the pop-up shop. We had 12,500g of clothing donated and the children took away 7,700g of clothing to re-use. Year 4 was delighted with their new clothing to take home. The clothing left over has been donated to the air ambulance charity to be re-used. We were lucky to have Year 8 students from Ormiston Forge join us for our event and to support Year 4 in the swap shop and we were all delighted with saving the clothing from ending up in landfill. Year 4 would like to thank parents/carers for supporting the event by donating clothing for the event.



Please see the below summary from Lucy, a Year 8 child at Ormiston Forge Academy who helped with the event.

'Today we went to Temple Meadow to help with their clothes swap project. Our day started with walking up to Temple Meadow in the scorching heat. When arriving we organised 12500g and separated them into categories including boys' girls and adults.

As the year 4s entered the class with big smiles on their faces we introduced our selves to them which was received with enthusiasm and excitement. The year 4s then browsed the selection of clothes, us year 8s supported them to try different items of clothing. All of the students left with at least 1 item of clothing and some even left with a second. In total 7700g amount of clothes were repurposed and 12500g amount of clothes were diverted from landfill.

Overall the event was a great experience and a great success. It left a positive impact to all students and all of them left with positive smiles.'
