

**New website:** Hopefully you have seen that our website has been completely updated and it is now much more vibrant and engaging and so much easier to navigate. It is such an improvement on our old website







#### Blue for the Loo

A big thank you to all for participating in our Blue for a Loo day raising money for toilet twinning. We started the day with a virtual whole school assembly where we had a guest speaker from the charity Toilet Twinning. The children learnt about why it is important to support this charity and thought about what it would be like to be unable to access a safe toilet. Did you know....one in four people in the world have no safe or clean toilet and over

700 million people have to go outside to go to the toilet?

Toilet twinning funds projects in poor communities to provide a basic toilet, access to clean water and education on hygiene. At Temple Meadow we raised £121.25

which will enable us to twin 2 toilets. Thank you for your support!



#### **Protective Behaviours**

As you aware, safeguarding is of up most importance at Temple Meadow and our Protective Behaviours culture is at the heart of school. As part of this, each term children renew their network hands, which help them to identify trusted adults they can talk to if they ever feel unsafe or worried. A big part of our protective behaviours curriculum is safe and unsafe touch, including privacy and consent. As I am sure you agree, this is a vital knowledge for pupils of all ages to help to keep them safe.

During the first couple of weeks of the new half term, we will be repeating our safe and unsafe touch lessons. These will be delivered in classrooms by class teachers and will be delivered at an age appropriate level for all pupils. The sessions will include the topics of consent, privacy and safe touch. As part of this, in line with National Curriculum, we ensure the correct names are used for body parts, such as penis and vagina. We understand that some parents wish to use alternative names for these body parts at home, which is personal choice; however we must ensure all children are able to communicate clearly to school staff should they need assistance and therefore we avoid any ambiguous terminology. We thank you for your continued support.

#### **Book Corner Competition Winners**

The Head boys and Head girls have chosen 1 Donaldson as the book corner competition winners this term because they have a Summer theme and it is very engaging for the children. The pupils even get to sit in a paddling pool to read a book or comic. They have chosen 'Eco Kids Planet' as their magazine for winning the competition.

#### Queen's Jubilee Day

Today, children arrived to school dressed in red, white and blue, the colours of the Union Jack flag. During the day, children learned about the reign of Queen Elizabeth II and the momentous events in

her life.

Children also had a garden party on our school field where they listened to school music and had a picnic with refreshments.

#### Science Fayre

We are excited to be running another Science Fayre at school this year. Children have all been invited to participate by designing their own science project. They can either work alone or work with a friend. We welcome collaborative work between family members and your child.

The project can be an experiment to answer a question, a problem and solution or a research project. It can be on any area of Science that interests your child, for example 'How many stars can we see?', 'How would I design an Icebreaker ship?', 'What would my family eat if we were polar explorers?', 'How do rainbows form?' or related to any other science question.

When your child has carried out their investigation or research they have to make a display board to communicate their learning to others. This can be made from a large cardboard box, opened out, painted or covered in wrapping paper and held together with tape. This display board should show the project title/question/problem, what your child predicts the answer is, what they did to investigate their question, what they found and a conclusion. If they want, they can include a small model or experiment and/or project notes.

All projects need to be brought to school on **Wednesday 22nd June 2022** for our School Science Fayre which will be held in the Dance Studio. The parents of those children who are participating will be invited to attend on the afternoon. Letters with more information regarding this will be sent out nearer the time. A panel of judges will help to choose the best projects and every child who enters will receive a certificate.

Please complete the reply slip on the letter sent out this week if your child is interested is taking part.

#### **Healthy Tuck Shop**



Pupil healthy tuck shop will be relaunched on Monday 13th June! Mrs Van Straaten is currently working with a group of pupils who will be responsible for obtaining pupil voice on the types of healthy snacks that will be available from the tuck shop each morning on the playground. The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services, but the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents and carers to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability, beliefs and family values. Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They can be set on home broadband and Wi-Fi, games consoles, mobiles, tablets and computers, apps and online services and search engines. #### Transition to new academic year



As we begin to prepare children for their transition to their new year groups, some of our children benefit from additional transition work. Mrs Van Straaten has been working with a group of representatives to obtain their pupil voice on what information they would like to gather in their own personal transition booklets. The group worked very collaboratively together and came up with some excellent suggestions as to things they would like to know about next year including:

- Who their new teacher will be and their person attributes (they all wanted to know if they will be kind).
- Which classroom they will be in?
- Will they have swimming next year?
- Can they walk home alone?
- Will they learn to play a musical instrument?
- Who will be their LSPs?
- They were also keen to tell their new teachers about themselves, what helps them to lean.
- Where will my calm down space be?
- Where will they enter school in the morning?
- Who will teach them for English and Maths?
- Where will their toilets be?

Mrs Van Straaten will now work with the representatives update the transition booklets and identified children will bring them home before the summer holidays. Parents will then be able to reflect refer to them during the holiday and use them to support children's return in September. Teachers have already begun to consider which children would benefit from having a personalised transition booklet but if you think it may be useful for your child then please do get in touch with Mrs Van Straaten to discuss further.


