Dear Parents/Carers,

Closing this term, I would like to say loudly an enormous thank you to everybody in all teams for all the incredible hard work that goes into ensuring Temple Meadow is such an engaging, 'warm', safe, well-cared for and well organised school community and environment. It is because we work so effectively within each team that collectively we create a school that we are all very proud of.

I would also like to say loudly that the quality of teaching and learning that happens throughout the day and every single day is something the teaching team should be very proud of. The time and energy teachers and support put into delivering quality learning experiences is phenomenal; the sophisticated way ICT is used to enhance learner engagement and experiences is high quality. If you walk into a Temple Meadow classroom during learning time, it is emotionally warm, engaging, safe, fun and purposeful. Learning behaviours from pupils are very positive and when some pupils make poor choices, the manner in which this is dealt with is very sensitive to wider needs. We frequently have visitors to school such as link governors or other Headteachers; our School Improvement Advisor and Inclusion Support Team; all are very complimentary of what they see. In our recent Governor link visit, it was said that there were 'high levels of expectation and engagement' with pupil writing and that 'pupil clearly demonstrate a sense of pride in their books.' The teaching team go so above and beyond every day and I think our Year 6 team exemplify this by running a KS2 SATS booster club (with the hook of hot chocolate) after school to support pupils getting the best possible outcomes in their KS2 SATS; they do this after a full on and busy day teaching—now that is dedication!

Year 1 visit to Dudley Zoo

On Monday 20th March 2023, Our Year 1 pupils had a lovely visit to Dudley Zoo to see the animals. They were so excited to see the tigers, lions and giraffes. Their behaviour was exemplary and we would like to thank all of the parent volunteers who came with us.

No ID? Apply For Free voter ID by Z5 April!

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

WHICH FORMS OF ID CAN I USE TO VOTE?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel
 Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- A photo driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state

Sandwell Keeps Talking

The development of children's spoken language is key in Early Years. This language development underpins all seven areas of learning and development. It is through quality interactions with adults and peers in a language-rich environment that children thrive. In Early Years we actively engage children in story-telling, role-play and conversations, where they can share ideas with support and modelling from their teachers and familiar adults. We provide opportunities for children to actively engage in stories, rhymes and poems and non-fiction texts. This enables them to use and embed new words in a range of contexts.

As parents and careers, you can support your child at home through frequently reading to them and through quality interactions and conversations. The Family Information Service offers a website for parents and carers with information and tools to support early language and communication with babies and young children. Sandwell Keeps Talking is Sandwell's initiative to promote Early Language and Communication Skills. The website is full of fantastic information on how you can support your child, as well as links to key services that support communication and language. From pregnancy to age 3-4 years you can find about how your child will develop and what stages they will be at in terms of their communication and language development. Sandwell 'Talking Tips' offers you 10 simple tips of how you can interact with your child on a daily basis.




