Dear Parents/Carers.

Thank you for your attendance at all of our face to face meetings and workshops we've had over the last few weeks. The information session for our new wraparound care providers **4 Community Trust (4CT)** was extremely well attended and we are on track and working hard on all the actions required to support a smooth transition.

Yesterday, Miss Dale delivered a really informative workshop on **Protective Behaviours** in school. Thank you to those that attended; we do hope you found it useful. A leaflet on our RSHE and Protective Behaviours curriculum will be sent to Parents/Carers shortly.

Elsewhere, over the last two weeks, we have hosted a Nursery Wellcomm workshop, a Year 1 Parent Phonic Workshop and Year 2 have been on a walk of the local area linked to their Geography topic.

Forthcoming Parents' Evening - it would appear our new way of booking online is making a really big difference to the number of Parents/Carers signing up for appointments; 65% of Parents/Carers have made an appointment so far. It is such an important opportunity for you to talk about educational achievement and barriers but also well-being and other issues linked to your child.

KS1 SATs

As you may be aware, Year 2 pupils have previously undertaken Key Stage 1 Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs). This year, it has been announced that these have now become optional for schools and therefore, it is up to each individual school whether to participate in these or not.

At Temple Meadow, we have decided that **we will not be participating in the optional KS1 SATs this academic year**. We strongly feel that this is in the best interests of our pupils' mental health and well-being and instead, will be adopting a more informal testing approach to gather data to inform our end of Key Stage 1 teacher assessments. These are reported in pupils' end of year school reports.

To support pupils' transition to Year 3, we will be using previous KS1 test materials, alongside our internal assessment systems, to support our end of year judgements. Pupils will complete assessments during summer 2, when the full Year 2 curriculum has been delivered and embedded. These will be undertaken in a way that is appropriate to pupils' needs, such as in small groups, rather than under the strict testing conditions previously associated with KS1 SATs that we feel is highly unnecessary for pupils aged 6 and 7. A separate letter has been sent to out Year 2 Parents/Carers.

MFL Curriculum

As a staffing team, we decided to change our language and reinvigorate the MFL curriculum. MFL is explicitly taught in Key Stage 2, as per the National Curriculum. However, at Temple Meadow, we have also chosen to expose EYFS and KS1 pupils to MFL to provide an understanding and interest into different cultures and to provide a prior knowledge for their transition into Year 3.

Therefore, we have chosen to teach French as our Modern Foreign Language. In making this decision, many different factors were taken into consideration such as teaching staff's prior knowledge, languages taught in secondary schools and real life applications.

French is the second most widely learned foreign language after English, being taught in every country of the world. It is also the fifth most widely spoken language in the world. In addition, we wanted to teach a language that not only would be useful in the future and provide our pupils with a good foundation for moving to secondary school, but that represented our school population.

Thank you to Year 6 for sharing Sienna's English work from last week.




















